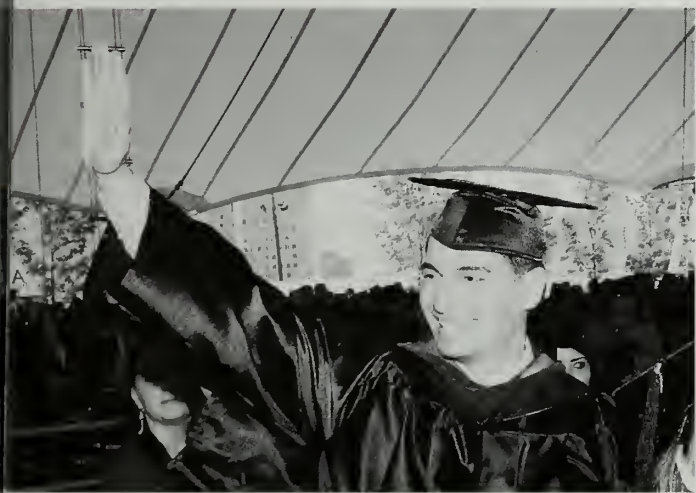












SGA President's Message

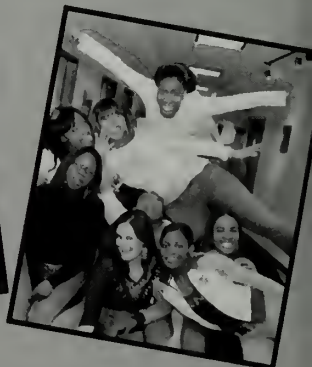

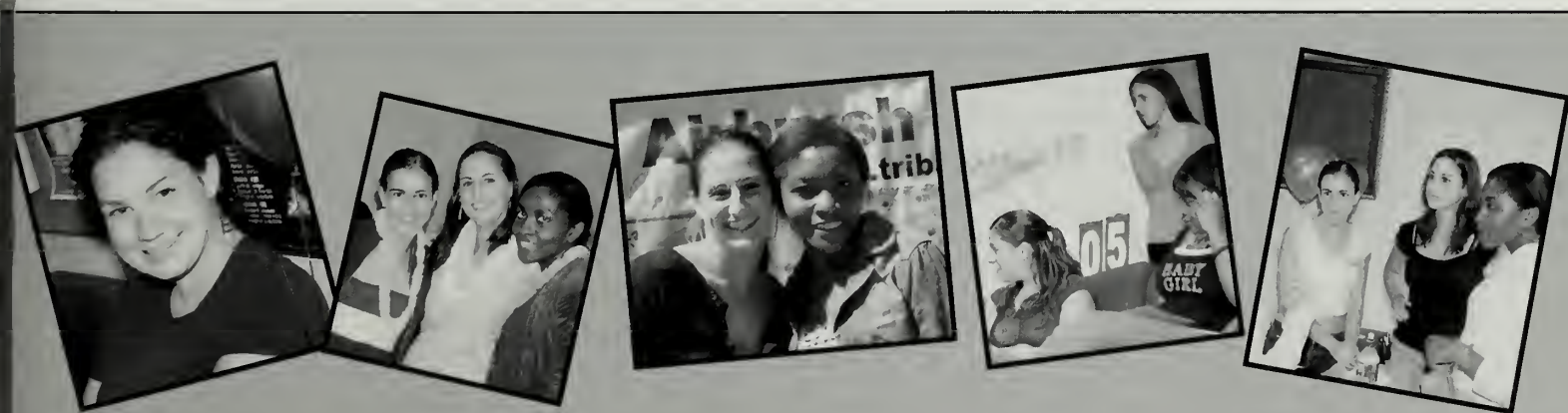

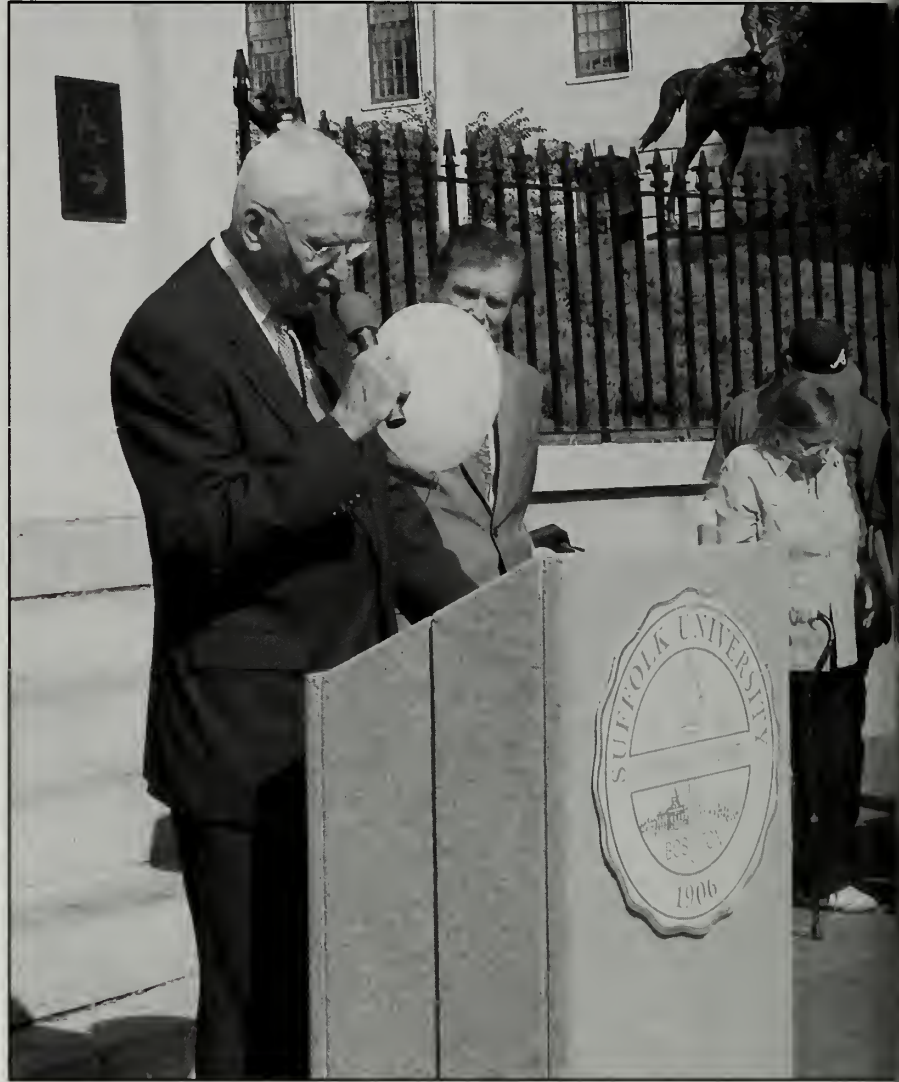
Student Activities Fair

Breast Cancer Walk



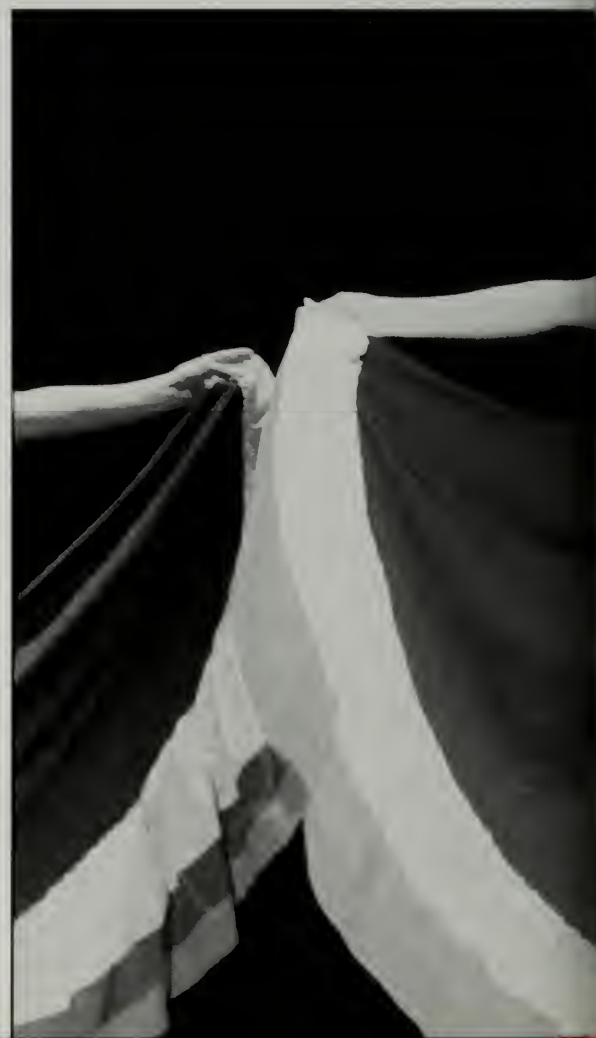

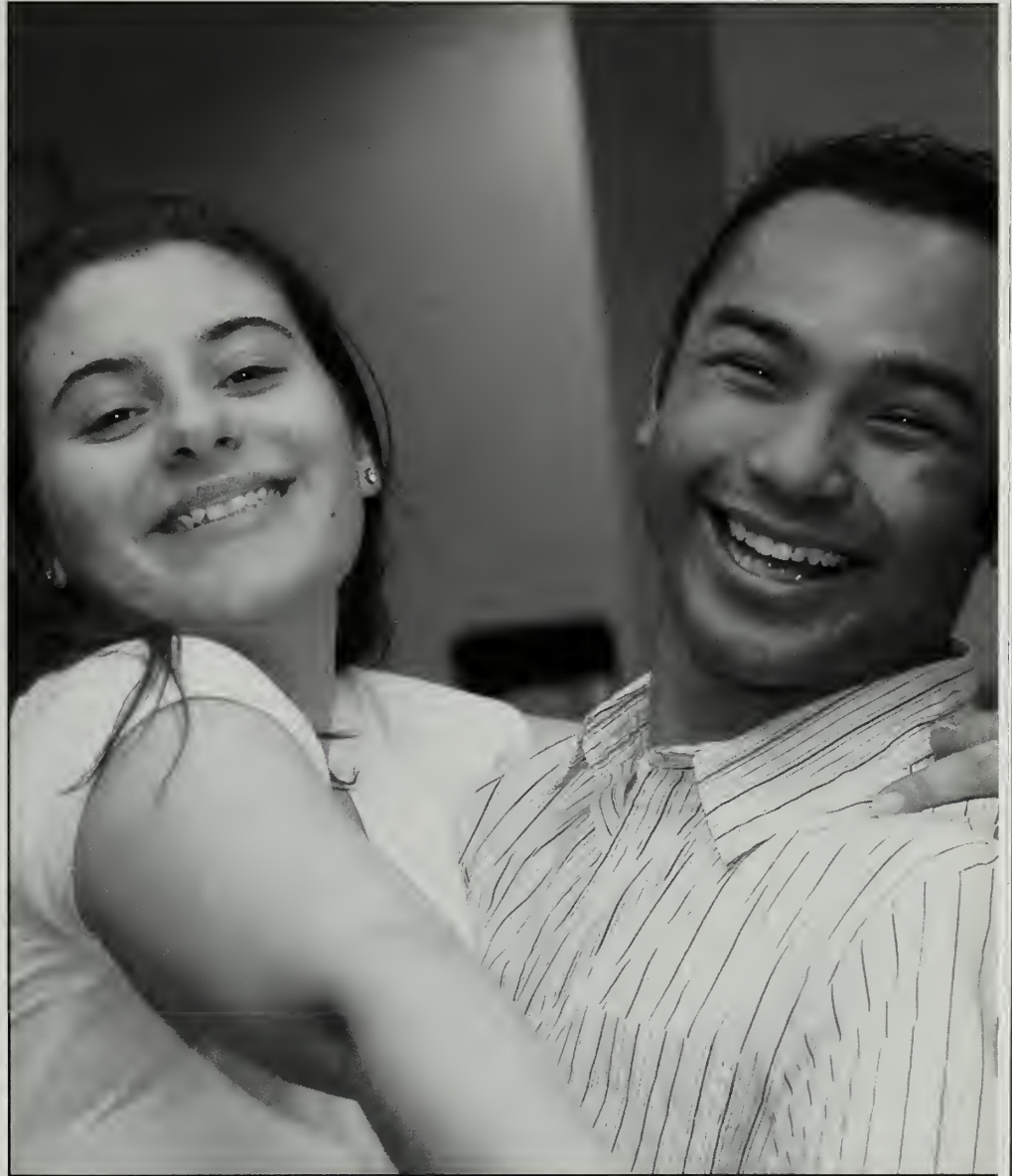

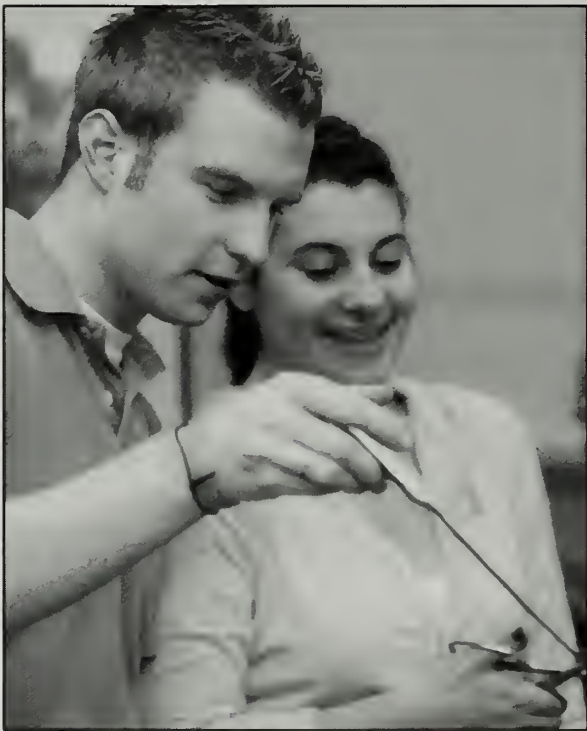
CSN Thanksgiving

African Diaspora

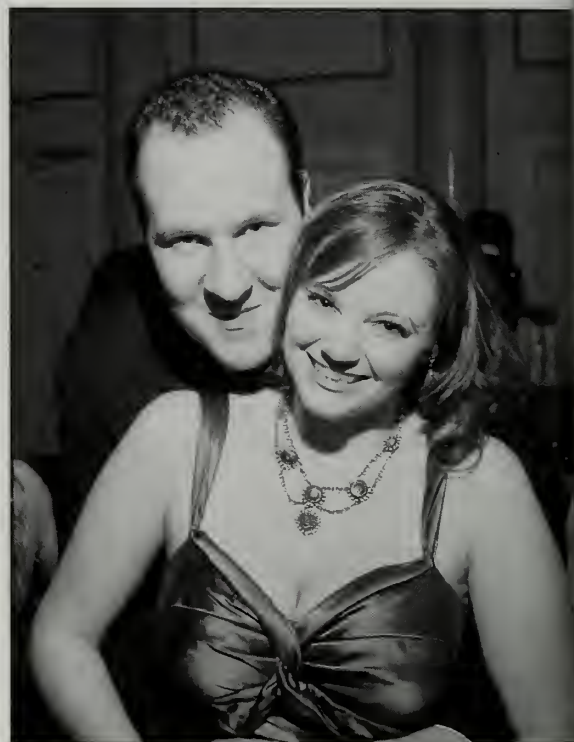

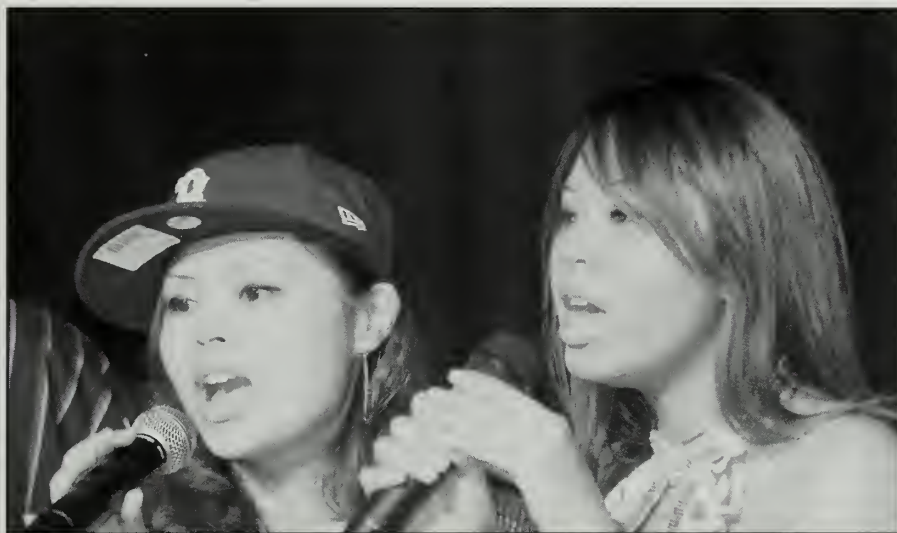




A Glimpse of Asia

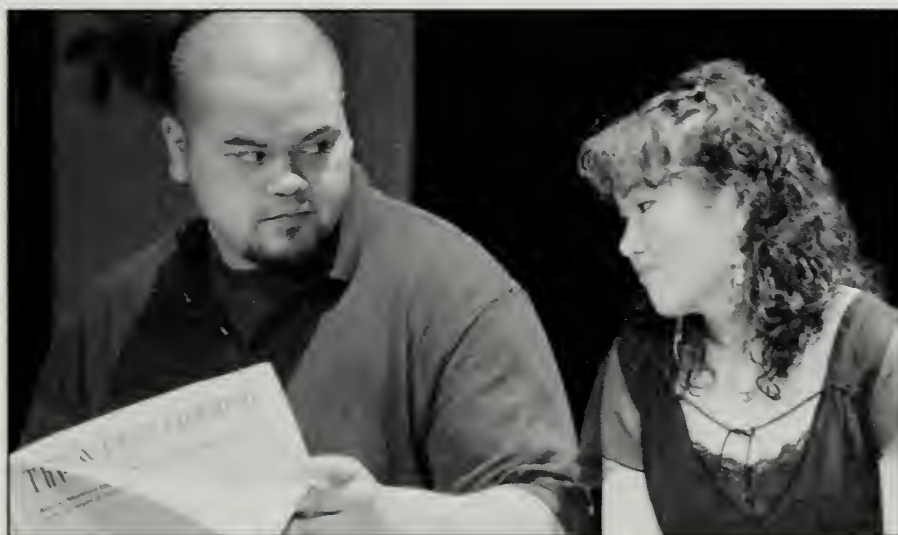


VSA Fahrenheit

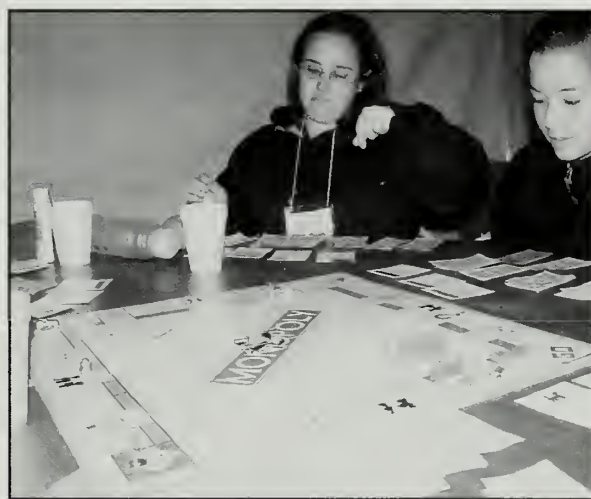

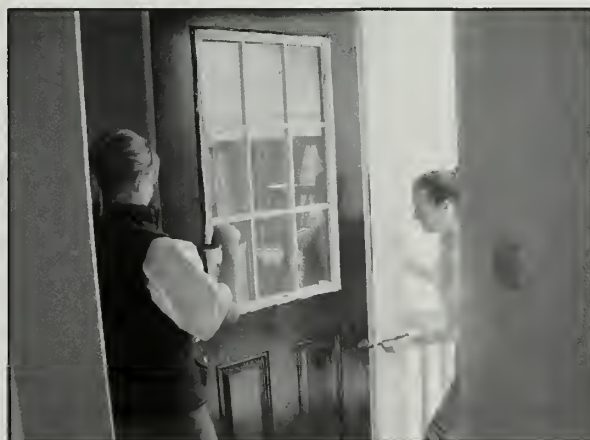




Alternative Spring Break

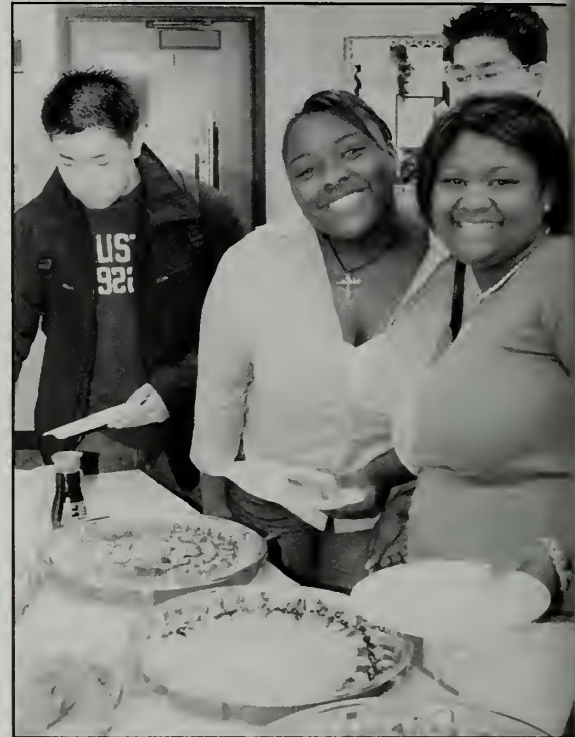

Leadership Awards



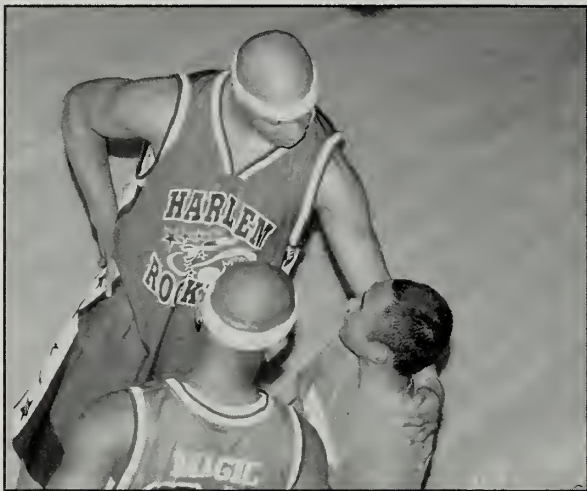

Suffolk Vs. Harlem Rockets

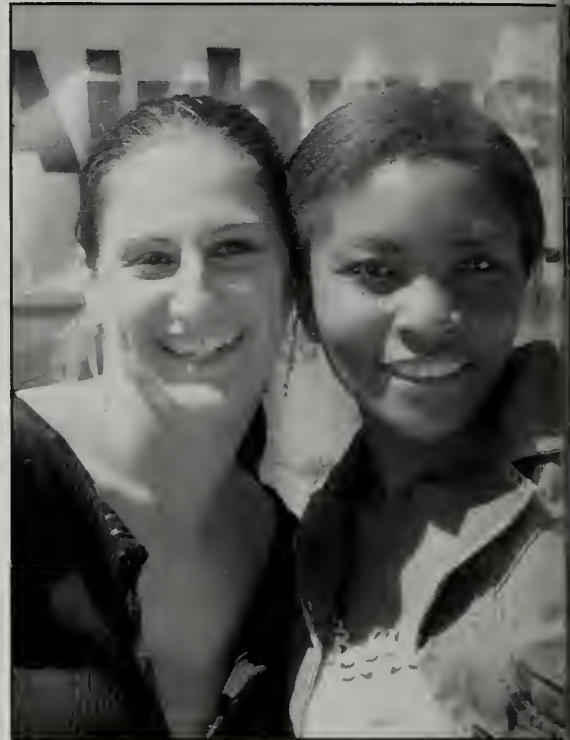
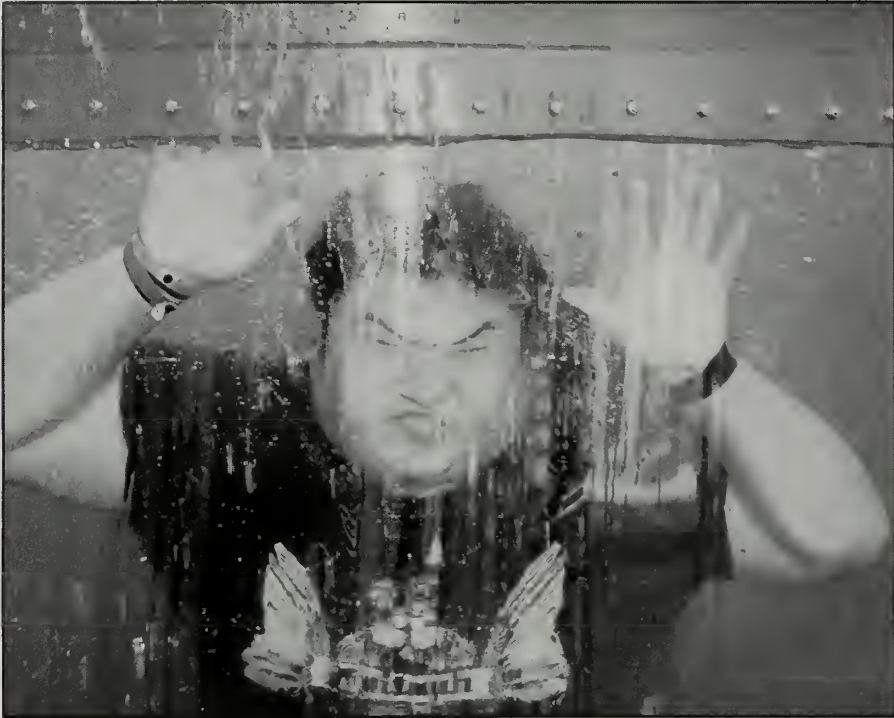

The Suffolk community watched as the Donahue Cafeteria was transformed into one happening prom that brought the audience back to the most exciting night of any Senior's high school career.

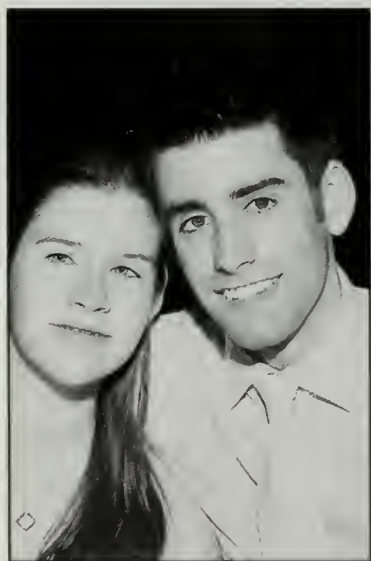




Spring Ball
