91% of Campaign Goal Reached

It is a pleasure to report the status of the Capital Campaign and the success of our fundraising program. As the following statistics indicate, we have collectively raised \$22.6 million and have only \$2.4 million to raise in order to reach the campaign goal of \$25 million. There is much to share with you in this issue of Campaign News, including:

- To date, we have secured 91% of our campaign goal; in 1996 that percentage was 20%.
- Over 3,000 major gift prospects have been identified and are in the process of being visited and solicited.
- Class agents have been identified for all three schools of the University.
- Regional alumni trips have been held in New York and the tri-state area,

Washington, DC, Vermont, Rhode Island, New Hampshire and Maine.

There is a separate alumni and development officer for the Law School,
 Sawyer School of Management and the College of Arts and Sciences.

I am indebted to everyone for helping the University realize its Capital Campaign goals.

Kresge Challenge Grant Awarded to Suffolk University Law School

We are pleased to announce that Suffolk University has received a \$500,000 challenge grant from The Kresge Foundation toward the construction of David J. Sargent Hall, the new Law School building on Tremont Street.

Since this prestigious award is granted to only one third of all applicants, we are among an elite group of institutions. Grants from The Kresge Foundation are made toward projects involving construction or renovation of facilities and the purchase of major capital


equipment or real estate. Grants are made on a challenge basis, requiring the raising of the remaining funds to insure completion of the project.

The Kresge Foundation will give Suffolk University \$500,000 toward the new Law School building once we raise the balance required to complete funding of the project. This means we must raise \$1,726,667 to complete the funding by July 1, 2000.

Funds Raised to Date By Source/By Individual School


LAW SCHOOL

Total Raised: \$14,368,718




COLLEGE OF ARTS & SCIENCES

Total Raised: \$3,813,515




SAWYER SCHOOL OF MANAGEMENT




GIFTS AND PLEDGES BY SOURCE
