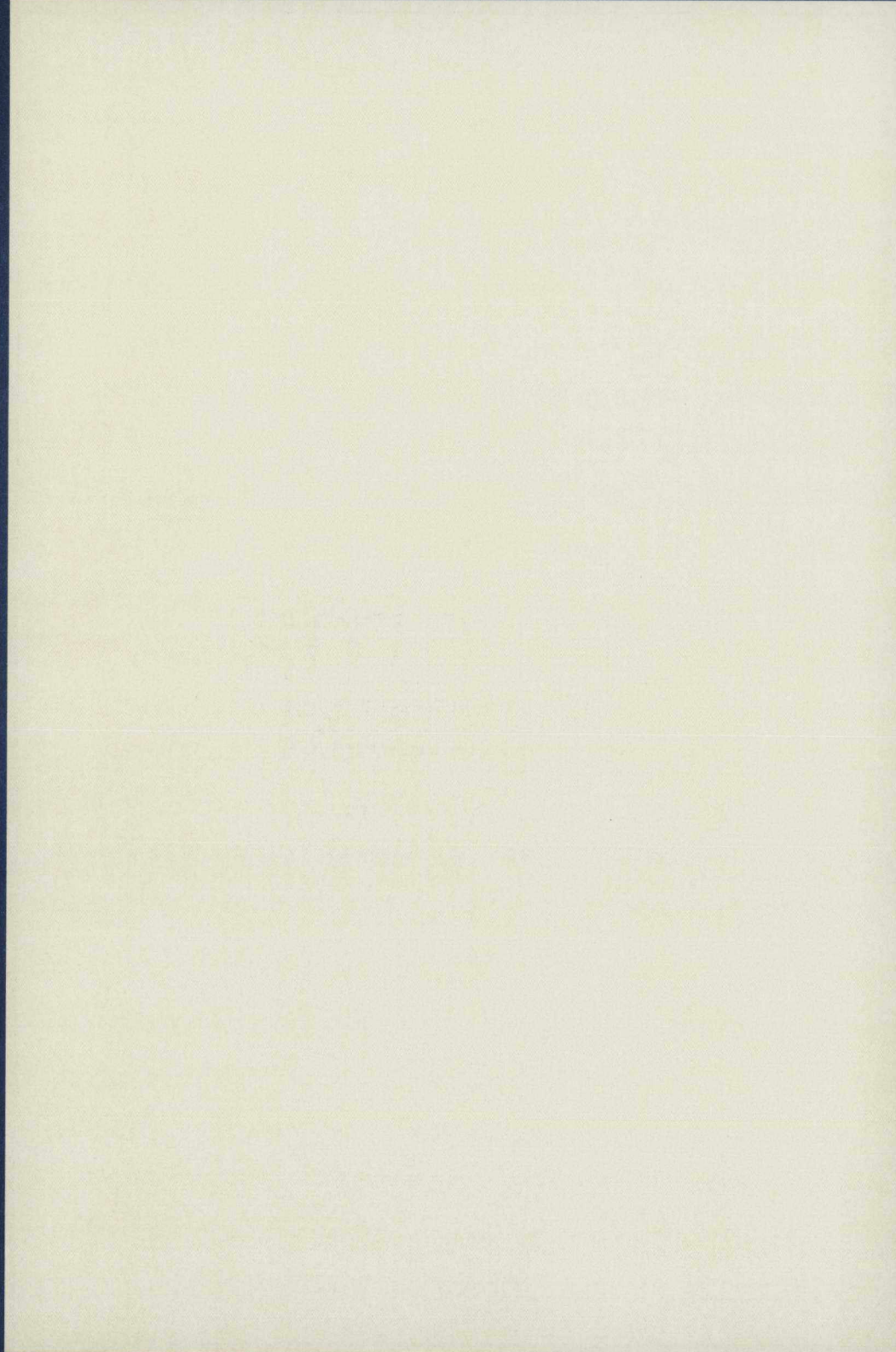

## SENATOR JOSEPH R. BIDEN, JR.

### *Honorary Doctor of Laws*

Joseph R. Biden, Jr., has represented the state of Delaware in the United States Senate since 1973 and in the intervening years has become known as a strong voice on foreign relations, terrorism, drug policy, and crime prevention.

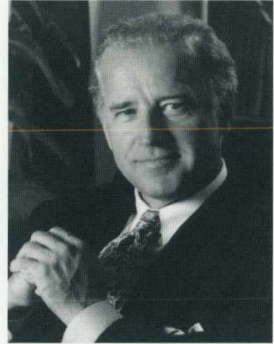
As the ranking Democrat on the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, Biden has been a key figure in shaping US foreign policy for more than 30 years. He has served as co-chair of the Senate NATO Observer Group, vice-chair of the NATO Parliamentary Assembly, and co-chair of the Senate National Security Working Group.

He also has been involved in writing major crime legislation, including the Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994, known as the Biden Crime Law, which increased funds for law enforcement, and the Violence Against Women Act of 2000.

Biden spent decades working on coastal issues and succeeded in having the White Clay Creek Watershed designated as Delaware's only National Wild and Scenic River, saving it from urban development. He also has been a strong advocate for college aid and loan programs.

Before serving in the Senate, Biden practiced law and served on the New Castle County Council. He is an adjunct professor at the Widener University School of Law, where he teaches a seminar on constitutional law.

He holds a BA in history and political science from the University of Delaware and a JD from the Syracuse University College of Law.



## P. LEO CORCORAN

### *Honorary Doctor of Commercial Science*

P. Leo Corcoran is a highly successful developer, owner, and manager of affordable housing communities in New England and the Southeast.

After serving in the Pacific during World War II, Corcoran, a Dorchester native, returned home and went to work in the Boston Fire Department. In the 1960s he joined his brother John in building their development firm, John M. Corcoran & Co.



The late John Corcoran was honored with an honorary doctor of commercial science degree from Suffolk University in 1982.

Leo Corcoran led a group of prominent businesspeople in establishing Caritas Communities, Inc., in 1985. The nonprofit, nonsectarian organization is devoted to creating affordable housing and has become the largest nonprofit provider of single-room-occupancy housing in New England. Caritas owns and manages 18 properties providing homes for more than 600 working men and women who would not otherwise have safe and decent residences.

Corcoran's philanthropy also benefits the fields of education, health care, and social services. In 1989 he established a merit-based scholarship at Suffolk University, and in 1992 he established the Vendome Firefighters Scholarship Fund at The Boston Foundation as a 20th-anniversary tribute to the nine brave men who lost their lives fighting the historic blaze at the former Hotel Vendome. The Vendome Firefighters Scholarship is annually awarded to Suffolk University undergraduate students.

## MASSACHUSETTS HOUSE SPEAKER SALVATORE F. DiMASI, JD '71

### *Honorary Doctor of Public Administration*

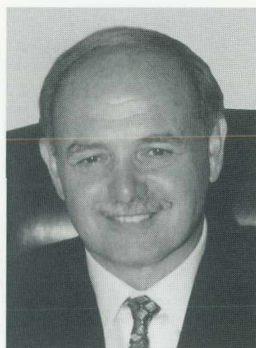
Speaker of the Massachusetts House Salvatore F. DiMasi, JD '71, is known as a diplomatic legislator with a facility for building consensus around issues of importance.

He was elected to the House in 1978, representing the 3rd Suffolk District, which includes his lifelong home, the North End of Boston. Among the key issues he has championed for his constituents and citizens across Massachusetts are affordable housing, home care, and prescription drugs for the elderly; expanded services for the homeless; economic stimulation and job creation; civil rights; and appropriate development of the Rose Kennedy Greenway that will grace the Big Dig.

DiMasi served as a Suffolk County assistant district attorney before entering private legal practice and running for public office.

He is a member of the Massachusetts, Boston, and American Bar Associations; the Commission on the Future of the Courts; the Justinian Law Society; Knights of Columbus; Sons of Italy; and Chinese Cultural Society. He has served on the board of Action for Boston Community Development. DiMasi's efforts as a public servant have earned him honors from a number of organizations, including the Massachusetts Psychological Association, Massachusetts League of Community Health Centers, Massachusetts Juvenile Bar Association, Massachusetts Family Planning Association, Jobs for Youth, and the Boston Chinese Community.

DiMasi is a graduate of Boston College and holds a JD from Suffolk University Law School.



## MICHAEL S. GRECO

### *Honorary Doctor of Laws*

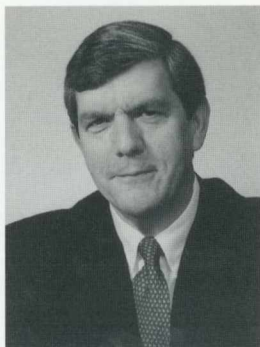
President-elect of the American Bar Association, Michael S. Greco has vast experience as a trial lawyer and has been a leader in ensuring that the legal needs of children and the poor are protected.

Greco is a partner with Kirkpatrick & Lockhart Nicholson Graham, LLP, in Boston and has worked in business, employment, and real estate litigation. He also has served as an arbitrator or mediator in a variety of disputes at the state and national levels.

He will become ABA president in August 2005, having served in the ABA House of Delegates since 1985 and as ABA delegate from Massachusetts since 1993. He has participated in a number of ABA committees, including the Task Force on Terrorism and the Law, which helped develop ABA policy in the wake of 9/11.

As president of the Massachusetts Bar Association in 1985, Greco joined the governor in appointing a blue-ribbon Commission on the Unmet Legal Needs of Children. He chaired the Massachusetts Legal Services for the Poor Needs Assessment and Plan for Action and was co-chair and cofounder of Bar Leaders for Preservation of Legal Services for the Poor. He also has served as the president of the New England Bar Association and the New England Bar Foundation and is a member of the American Law Institute.

He received a BA from Princeton University and a JD from Boston College Law School, where he was editor-in-chief of the *Boston College Law Review*.





## JACKIE JENKINS-SCOTT

### *Honorary Doctor of Public Service*

Jackie Jenkins-Scott is president of Wheelock College in Boston, an institution dedicated to improving the quality of life for children and their families by educating professionals who meet their needs.



She took the helm at Wheelock in 2004 after 21 years as president and chief executive officer of Dimock Community Health Center in Roxbury. As a result of Jenkins-Scott's leadership, Dimock offers a wide range of services extending beyond health care, including programs for women and children as well as adult education and skills training. Before joining Dimock Community Health Center, Jenkins-Scott worked in the Massachusetts Departments of Public Health and Mental Health. Her accomplishments as a community leader, public health advocate, and innovator have won her national acclaim for 25 years.

Her efforts on behalf of the community extend to service on a number of boards, including the Kennedy Library Foundation and Museum, Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center, and Tufts Health Plan. Among her awards and citations is the 2004 Pinnacle Lifetime Achievement Award from the Greater Boston Chamber of Commerce.

Jenkins-Scott earned a BS from Eastern Michigan University and an MSW from Boston University School of Social Work. She was a postgraduate research fellow at Radcliffe College.

## STUART KWOH

### *Honorary Doctor of Laws*

Stewart Kwoh is president and executive director of the Asian Pacific American Legal Center of Southern California, which under his leadership has become the largest and most diverse legal assistance and civil rights organization serving Asian Pacific Americans in the nation. He also is vice-chair of the board of directors for the National Asian Pacific American Legal Consortium.



The Asian Pacific American Legal Center provides services to more than 15,000 people each year for issues ranging from citizenship and government benefits to sweatshop exploitation and hate crimes. The *Los Angeles Times* has called Kwoh one of the nation's leading advocates for Asian Americans and cited his ability to bring together people from diverse backgrounds.

Kwoh was named a MacArthur Foundation Fellow in 1998. He has been widely cited for his work through awards and honors, including his description as one of the 100 most powerful and influential lawyers in California by *California Law Business* and as Lawyer of the Year by *California Lawyer* magazine in 1998.

He serves on the boards of a number of community organizations, including the Coalition of Humane Immigration Rights of Los Angeles and the Los Angeles Charter Reform Commission. He also is active in several foundations, nonprofit groups, and philanthropic organizations, including the Methodist Urban Foundation and the California Consumer Protection Foundation.

Kwoh earned a BA at the University of California, Los Angeles, and a JD from the UCLA Law School. He also is an instructor at UCLA.



## DOUGLAS W. NELSON

### *Honorary Doctor of Humanities*

Throughout his career, Douglas W. Nelson has been a nationally recognized advocate for disadvantaged families and children. He is president of the Annie E. Casey Foundation, based in Baltimore, which aims to build positive futures for the nation's children and tracks their status through its KIDS COUNT program. As an innovative social leader, he has promoted family-centered, community-based responses to some of the problems facing vulnerable families.



Nelson studied and taught social history at the University of Wisconsin before he was tapped to serve as assistant secretary of Wisconsin's Department of Health and Social Services. Later, he was deputy director of the Center for the Study of Social Policy in Washington, DC.

His public service includes serving as vice chair of the Foundation Center in New York, co-chair of the Jim Casey Youth Opportunities Initiative, chair of the New York City Special Advisory Panel on Child Welfare, and as a member of the American Bar Association's Commission on the Legal Problems of the Elderly. He has written widely on social policy issues, and *Heart Mountain*, his history of the relocation of Japanese-Americans during World War II, earned a Pulitzer Prize nomination in 1976.

Nelson is a graduate of the University of Illinois, where he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. He holds a master's degree in history from the University of Wyoming.

## THE HONORABLE REGINA L. QUINLAN, JD '73

### *Honorary Doctor of Laws*

Regina L. Quinlan, JD '73, has served as an associate justice of the Massachusetts Superior Court since 1992. She was appointed by then-Governor William F. Weld following nearly two decades serving clients as a sole practitioner.



In her trial practice, Quinlan represented clients in both criminal and civil cases. She brought appeals in state and federal courts and was involved in proceedings before state, local, and administrative agencies and boards.

Beginning in 1971, Quinlan worked as an assistant editor at Quinlan Publishing Co., Inc., a family business that publishes monthly law digests. From 1978 to 1992, she served as attorney for the corporation on a part-time basis.

She is a member of the Massachusetts Judges Conference and, before she joined the bench, had served as president and vice-president of the Massachusetts Trial Lawyers Association and had been involved with the Massachusetts Bar Association, the American Bar Association, and the First Amendment Lawyers Association.

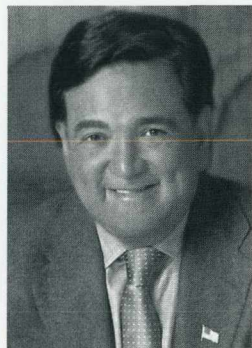
Her community involvement has included membership on the boards of Regis and Aquinas Colleges and Rosie's Place. She also was a member of the finance council of St. Mary parish in Charlestown.

## GOVERNOR BILL RICHARDSON

### *Honorary Doctor of Public Administration*

Governor of New Mexico since 2003, Bill Richardson has succeeded in improving education at all levels, increasing access to quality health care, and cutting taxes for working citizens. He also has developed a statewide water plan—a critical issue in the West—and is credited with implementing a clean-energy agenda that is a model for the nation. Under his leadership, New Mexico is a national leader in job growth and economic momentum.



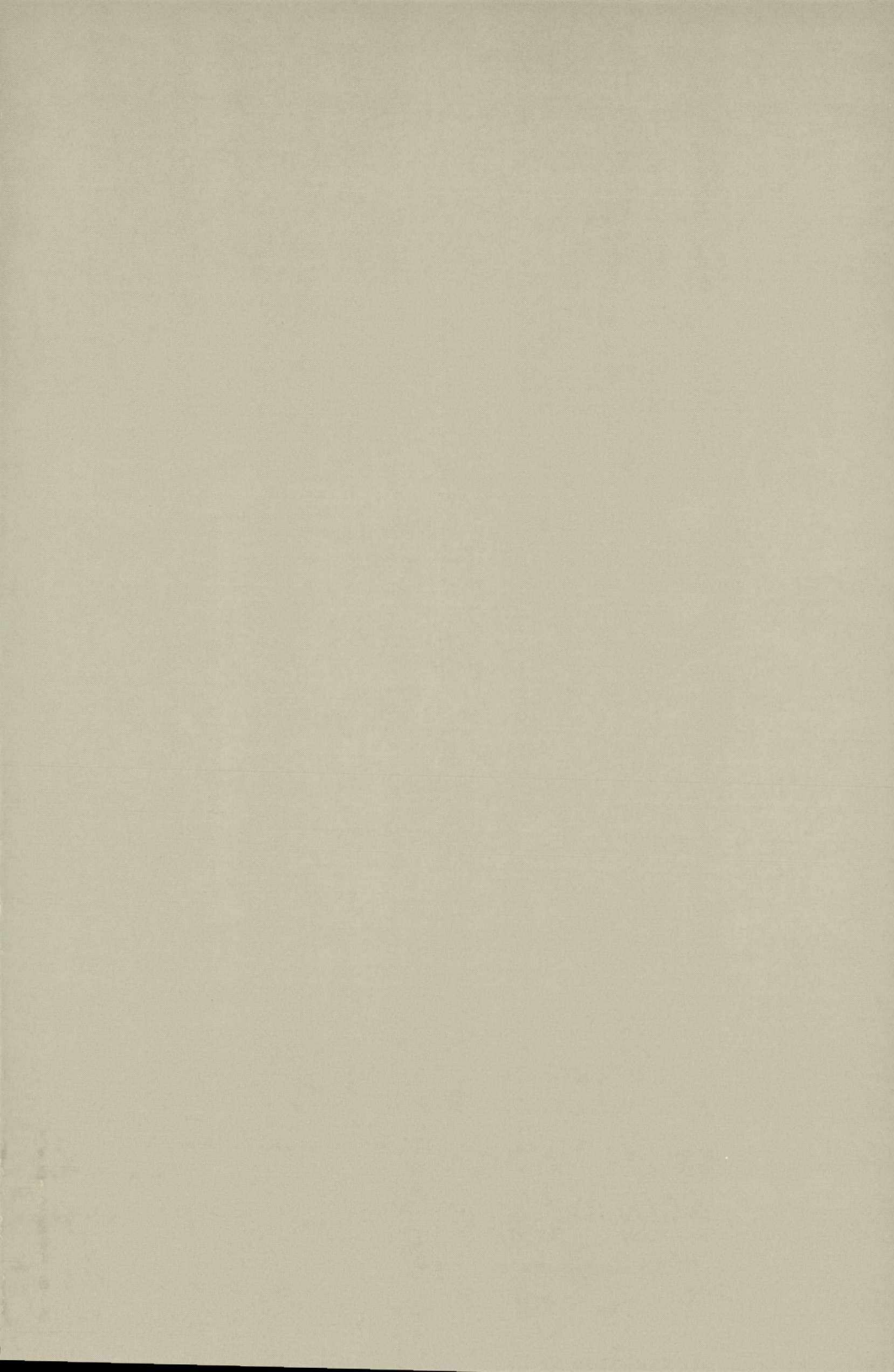
Richardson represented New Mexico's 3rd Congressional District in Congress for 15 years. He also served as the US ambassador to the United Nations in 1997 and was US Secretary of Energy from 1998–2000.

He has taught at Harvard's Kennedy School of Government and at the United World College in Montezuma, New Mexico.

Richardson is chairman of the Democratic Governors' Association and is past chairman of the Western Governors' Association, the Border Governors' Conference, and the 2004 Democratic National Convention.

He is chairman of Freedom House, a nonpartisan organization that promotes democracy worldwide, and serves on many boards, including the Natural Resources Defense Council and United Way International.

He earned a BA from Tufts University and an MA from the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy at Tufts.
